We are in A Precarious Moment for Progress

Recent Polls Increase the Risk That Districts Will Lose Focus on Morale

Recent Surveys Show Positive Momentum in Teacher Sentiment

What Makes a Teacher Effective?

70% of relevant studies concluded that **teachers with the lowest morale also had the lowest academic student outcomes** across core subjects.



It's Easy for Districts to Miss the Mark

With Key Demands Out of Reach, Leaders Default to Surface-Level Solutions

Nearly 30% of teacher education programs saw **a decline in enrollment** this year.

A 23.5% average teacher pay gap makes **competitive pay a long way off**

The #1 strategy for improving teacher morale for **80% of districts**



Increase Appreciation



Cited as one of the top two strategies for raising morale by **95% of districts**

Self Care: An Important, But Often Tone Deaf, Message

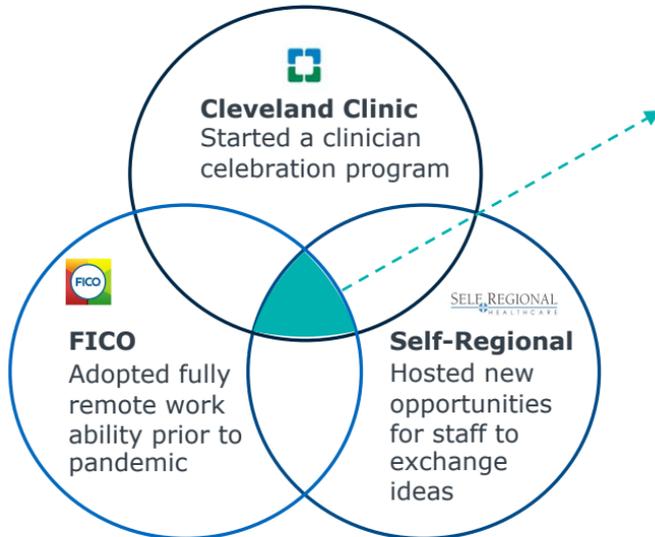

The Morale Doctor

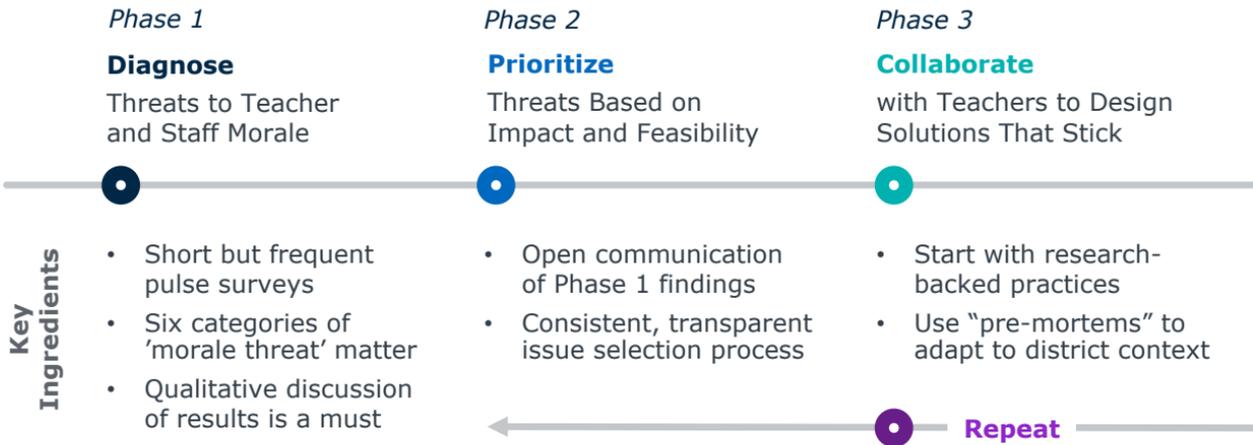
- Diagnoses organizations' unique **root causes** of low employee morale

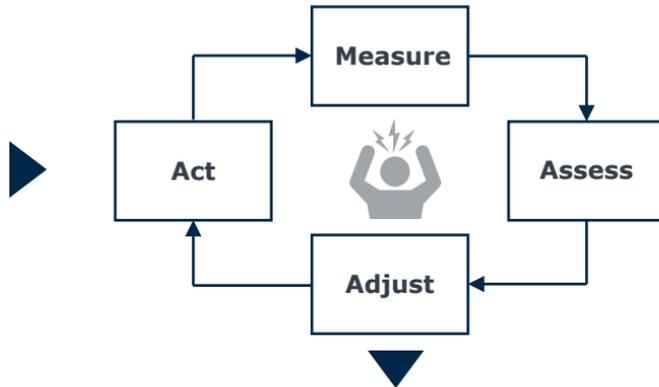

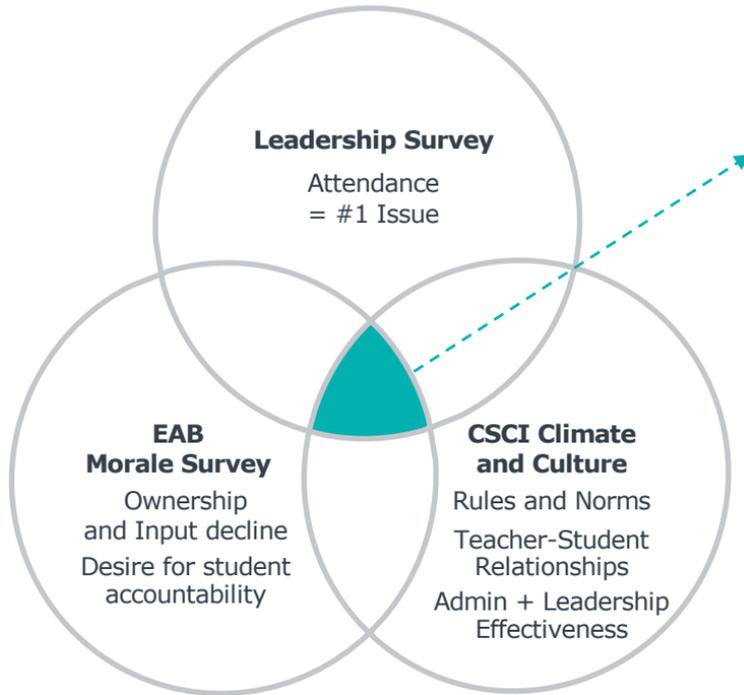

Finding the Highest Leverage Issue to Solve



Statement of Work

For the 2025-26 school year the primary focus of our work and measure of success will be improvement in the area of **attendance**.

- Improvement will be driven by increased **accountability and consistency** in consequences, paired with interventions and supports
- Through this work we believe that student **academic performance** will increase along with **staff morale**
- This will be demonstrated through our **Strategic Plan indicators and measures**

A Three-Pronged Strategy to Improve Attendance



District 99 Attendance KPIs and Strategy

KPI 1 = % of students who regularly attend school

KPI 2 = % of students who are supported to regularly attend school

Improve Attendance Data Quality

- Infinite Campus adoption
- Building entrance scanning
- Classroom and office scanning
- Unaccounted for report
- Weekly and monthly data reviews
- Monday/Thursday reports emailed to teachers

Establish Consistent Expectations

- 5 Tier 1 + 5 Tier 2 expectations for all stakeholder groups

Improve Student Engagement and Relationships

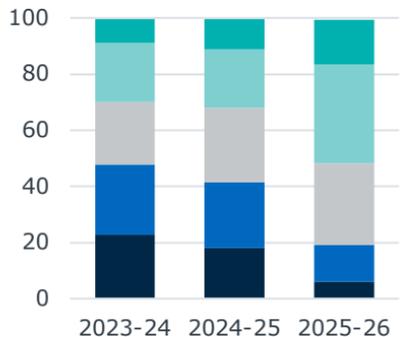
- Student Handbook changes + classroom support
- Personal device storage policy to decrease distractions
- No verbal warning for non-compliance



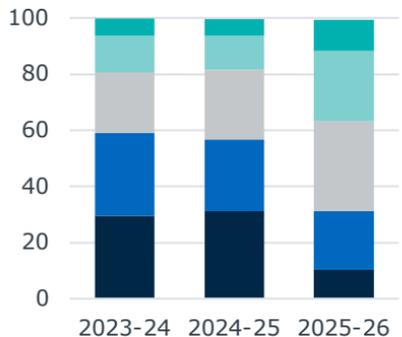

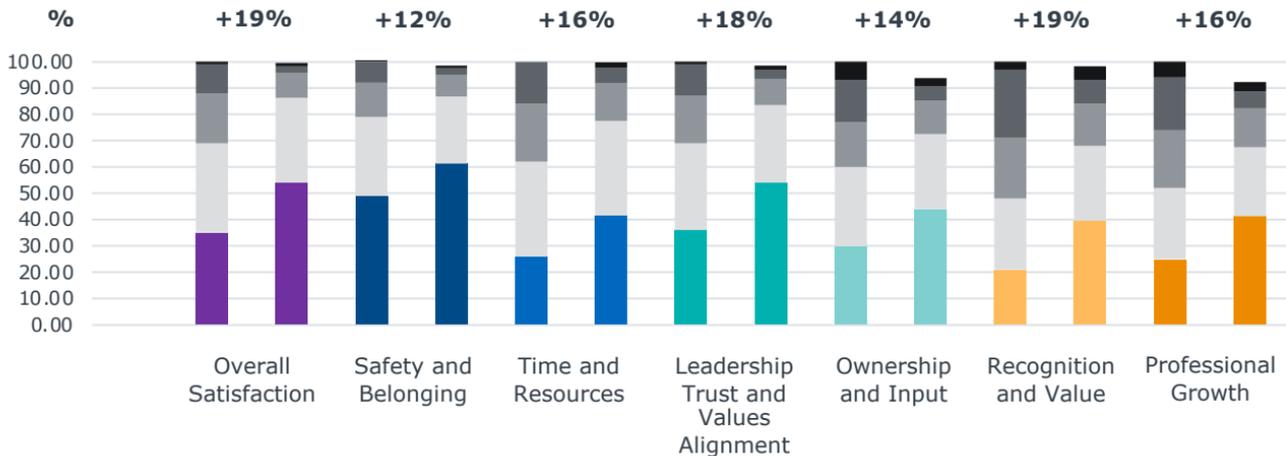

Refining the Process to Accelerate Progress



Process Enhancements

2021-22

- EAB Morale Collaborative participation
- Immediate transparency with results
- Used Thought Exchange to explore issues in survey
- Built morale process into strategic plan to elevate importance

2022-23

- Added demographic question for school level data
- Gave school teams autonomy over process with two requirements
 - Share data with staff
 - Identify a culture team to review and build an action plan

2023-24

- Developed a 'hot spot' report
- Expanded feedback loops (student feedback sessions, discipline conversations, instructional material feedback opportunities)

2024-25

- Implemented staff feedback process
- How are the children? (Principal Highlights)
- Connection to the school improvement/building inquiry process

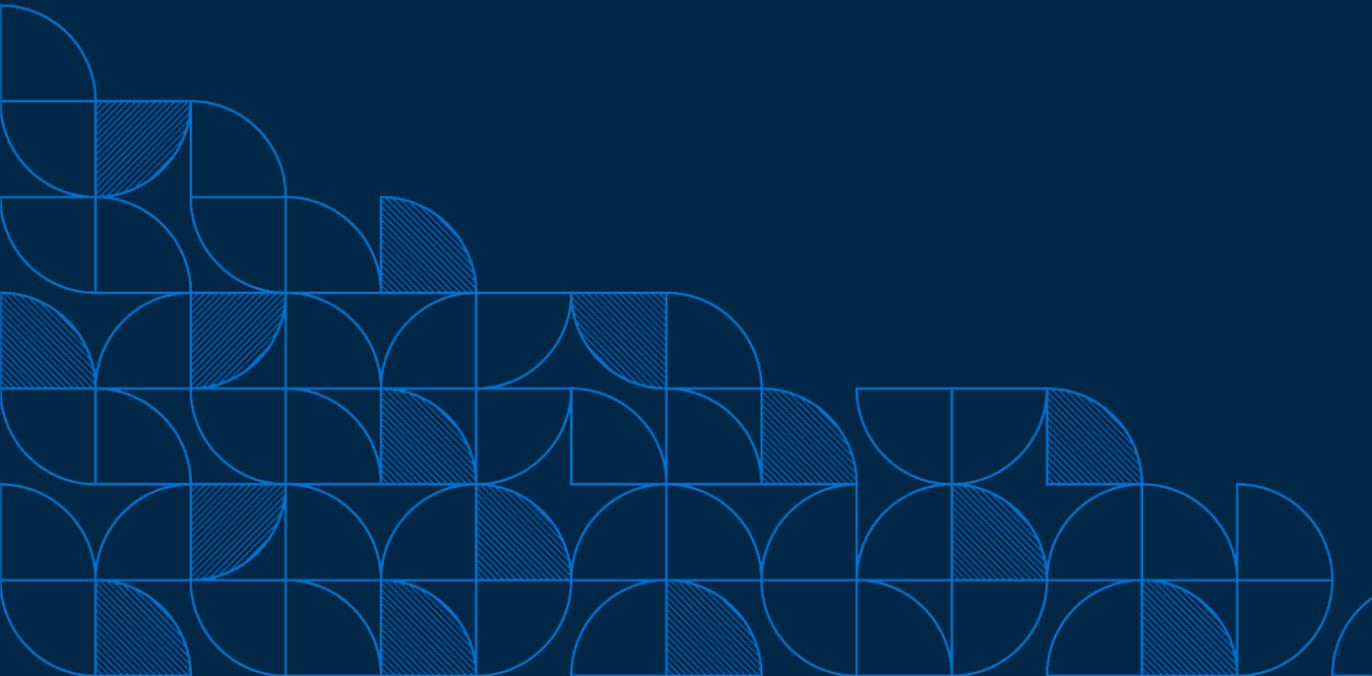

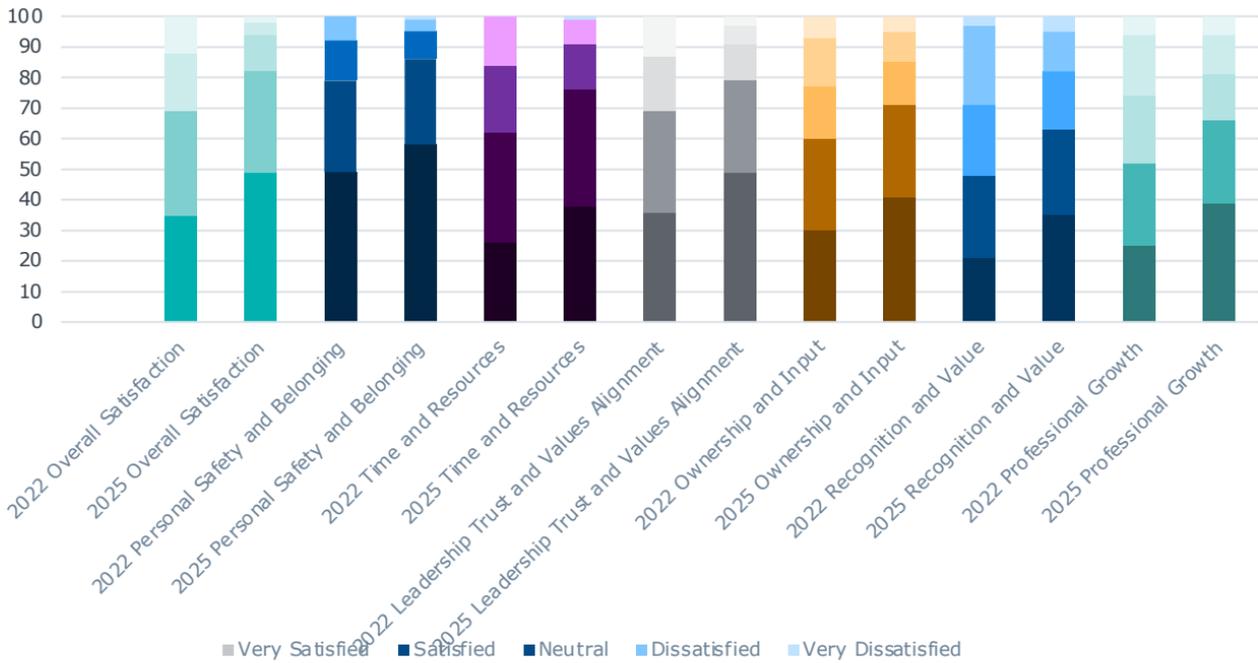

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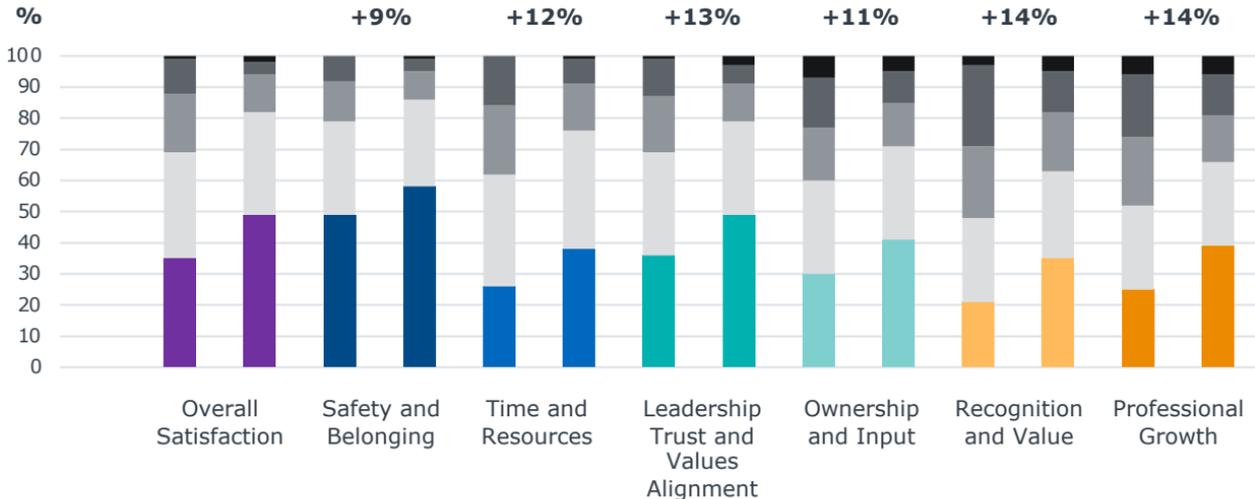
